I. Last week, we were reminded of how we are all stewards who live in this "in-between" gift of time our God has given to us and of how, while there will always be a great deal that competes for our attention . . . many distractions in this life . . . in this "inbetween" time . . . that will compete for our hearts . . . our loyalty . . . our energy and faith . . . the gift of time God has blessed us with in this life will always be connected to the eternal time God calls us to prepare for in the life yet to be . . . a path to follow . . . not measured by hours or days or the various experiences that, on occasion, consume us . . . but to a happiness and a joy without end . . .

The late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, Archbishop of Chicago, in his book, "The Gift of Peace", written shortly before he died from terminal Cancer, recalled how during bouts of illness, treatment, and other difficult situations that all seemed to be coming down on him at one time, he was mentally and physically exhausted. He would try to wake early in the morning to enter into his regular prayer routine and found that was becoming increasingly more difficult, along with his ability to maintain any prayerful focus. change this life-line routine . . . even forgo it . . . but then realized that this would be foolish on his part . . . he needed to make himself available to God and even if he could not pray . . . even if he could not maintain focus . . . no matter the circumstance . . . he would not give that time to anyone other than God . . . for he was convinced that God would do the work God wanted to do . . . and all God asked of him was to make himself available . . . to offer a portion of God's gift of time back to God . . .

II. Far too often, we human persons ... "stewards" of what God has given to us, forget this important truth ... far too often, we take everything God has blessed us with ... time ... talent ... and yes, treasure ... and spend it or use it on our need for our personal satisfaction and happiness now ... and not even consider giving God back any portion in gratitude.

"But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.". .

Certainly, we could stop short and get caught up in that whole notion of **fear** . . . but the fear spoken of

in this particular passage from the Book of the Prophet Malachi isn't intended to cause us to be **afraid** of the Lord . . . to run and hide from the Lord . . . which is impossible to do. No, this biblical image of fear is intended to communicate our profound respect . . . our awe of the Lord . . . the Lord . . . who is great beyond our comprehension and yet chooses to dwell among us . . . with us . . . bless us . . . care for us . . .

But how do we respond?

III. Consider another image, if you will.

The image is given us by Nicolaus Copernicus, a late 15th century/early 16th century scholar in many fields, but, in particular, that of astronomy . . .

Some may recall that he put forth a particular astronomical theory that was really shocking at the time. Copernicus formulated a theory that put the sun at the center of the universe, rather than the earth which changed the whole way in which the universe was then viewed ... had been viewed for centuries In other words, rather than the Sun and, for that matter, any other planets, revolving around the

Earth . . . it was the Earth that revolved around the Sun, along with other planets that did the same.

The image presents a significant challenge for us ... oh, not because I think that any of us is holding on to an old understanding of astronomy an understanding not even taught in schools these days, nor hast it been for centuries.

I would suggest that the significant challenge for us is just where we understand God to be ... or for that matter, the place we have for him in our lives. Do we see God at the center of our lives ... or, do "we think that it is God's job to circle around us?" Has God become our "administrative assistant ... the one who answers prayers ... our way ... makes us peaceful and happy and successful ... now"?

Truthfully, there is nothing wrong with understanding that God **is** the one who answers prayers . . . that God **is** the **source** of **peace . . .**

happiness ... blessings ... unless, that is, we have taken this one step further and also view God as the one who exists to "serve me" ... and on occasion, I may give Him some time ... on occasion ... I may use any of the talents God has blessed me with to serve Him by serving others ... on occasion ... I may take some of my treasure and give it back so that the work needed to spread the Gospel ... lead others to the Lord Jesus ... care for the poor and the hungry ... may happen. Yes, on occasion, I may do these things ... so that this and more can continue

This belief and conviction that God is truly to be the center of our lives calls for a conscious and committed change for each of us in our relationship with God . . . but a change, that none-the-less, will have **amazing**, **grace-filled** results . . . that give way to even more blessing in our lives.

Imagine . . . imagine if we really believed . . . truly were convicted and convinced that God is greater than me . . . greater than you . . . greater than any individual or thing we can possibly consider . . . if we did . . . why would we put anything else . . . **anyone else** . . . at the center of our life?
